Synopsis	After both Britain and Russia lose one of their submarines, MI6 receives information that somebody has developed a device enabling them to track the supposedly secret course of nuclear subs. Bond investigates, and in doing so reluctantly teams up with beautiful Soviet agent, Anya Amasova, known as Agent XXX. The trail leads them to Carl Stromberg, reclusive owner of the world's largest shipping line, who is intent on using stolen nuclear weapons to wipe out and start a new civilisation under the sea. Along the way, Bond battles the indestructible Jaws and has to put Q's submersible Lotus Esprit to the test.
